## **Intro to 2 Timothy 1:8-14**

One of the most beautiful things about the gospel is the grace of God. As Pastor Don mentioned, the grace of God is so multifaceted that we ought to meditate on the breadth of what Scripture has to say about it. Often, when grace becomes one-dimensional in our thinking, it can cease to amaze us. Indeed, many who have been in church for a long time hear the word grace and it doesn't resonate deeply in their souls because they have heard it so much, or because they have forgotten about the depth of the grace of God towards us in Christ.

Thankfully, Paul knows that Timothy needed grace to carry out his God-given ministry and so do we! Jesus said, "apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:5). That is absolutely true. The problem is: we can deceive ourselves into thinking that we don't need Christ. We begin to think that we are the ones who deserve the credit for providing for even our basic needs let alone accomplishing the ministry tasks God has commanded us to do. Thankfully, Paul is there to remind us that we need God for every moment of every day (and therefore every activity). So, let us not only be amazed again by grace, but let that amazement motivate us to pass the gospel on to others.

### **Context**

In this section, Paul expounds a bit on what he meant in chapter one by "guard the good deposit entrusted to you" (2 Tim. 1:14). Guarding the gospel necessarily entails entrusting it to others who are able to teach others still. God's plan of redemption has included, since the beginning of time, that people from all nations, tribes, and tongues would worship His Son Jesus. The way He has chosen to bring that about is through the faithful ministry of His servants. Whether Timothy in first century Ephesus, or us in twenty-first century Lansing, the process of ministry is the same.
