Awaken Parent Letter

Hello Parents! We will be entering into a new series on April 10. **Red Flags, Respect, and Relationships** is a series that discusses sexual integrity from a biblical perspective. It focuses on where we place our desires and what values we find in our hearts, and how those things can affect our interactions with other people and how we respect ourselves. We are letting parents know in advance so they can make the best decision for their child. As always, we want to partner with parents as they disciple their kids.

For the following 4 weeks, these will be the topics of our lessons and small group discussions at Awaken:

- April 10: God cares about what we do with our desires.
- April 17: God cares about what we do with our freedom.
- April 24: God cares about how we value ourselves and others.
- May 1: God cares about us demonstrating love before looking for love.

This series does not directly discuss pornography, but we acknowledge that it's a major issue even among kids this young. Because of this, we think the topic of relationships (and addressing how we need to view others and ourselves with respect) is worth talking about at church. We'd also like to provide some resources so that you, as parents, can make educated decisions for your child. Take a moment to read the Fast Facts about porn.

We are not sharing these facts to breed fear and mistrust, but to present the realities of porn and how it has changed our culture's interactions and relationships with other people. And since this is a reality for our students (and is accessible whether they have their own phone and/or computer), we feel it
