Intro to The Cosmic Battle

The gospel is the good news that, in Jesus, God has made full and final atonement for our sins and has defeated our greatest enemies—Satan, sin, and death. This good news is central to the story of the Bible. Not only does it appear at the heart of the entire Bible in the stories of the Gospels, but it develops progressively from the very beginning of the Bible.

In Genesis 3, all hope seems lost. Adam and Eve had sinned against the God who made them and provided them with everything to enjoy. Their sin brought not only themselves but the entire world under the righteous curse of God. This meant that life was going to be difficult, painful, and short. What's worse, even though they made their own choice to sin, they had done so at the urging of one of the creatures they were meant to rule over—the serpent.

So, part of the chaos the world was thrown into as a result of sin was that humanity would be subject, not to God alone, as we had originally been created to be, but also to one of His creatures—Satan himself.

Satan would prove to be a cruel master. He is exacting in his own demands for obedience, but there is no hope or offer of redemption, only more misery. But God, in His great love for His creatures, committed from the very beginning to fighting the battle on our behalf and winning the decisive victory to secure our salvation.

What a great comfort it is to us to know that in Christ our greatest enemies have been defeated and we have assured hope of eternal life free from Satan, sin, and death.
