Introduction to Ephesians 5:15-18

These are certainly interesting times in which we live. Recent technological advances have meant that life today is, in very practical ways, unlike life has ever been before on the earth. A person can travel half-way around the world in less than a day. If you don't have the money to do that, perhaps you can just use FaceTime and still speak face-to-face with someone who lives half way around the world. We have sent animals, people, and now cars into space. These are truly fascinating times in which we live.

And yet, in some ways, life has not changed at all. Like Paul, who lived in the first century AD, we live in evil days. With all of the technological changes, we still have not been able to solve the problem of sin in the human heart. We still have not been able to fixate accurately on the will of God. And we are still hopeless apart from the Holy Spirit filling us and quickening our hearts to see the beauty of Christ and to obey His commands. It is into this world that Paul speaks, and because ours is so similar, continues to speak even today.

Context

Still in the middle of the "sit-walk-stand" structure of Ephesians, this section of Ephesians 5 somewhat concludes Paul's argument on the generalities of following Jesus and "walking" in love, in light, and in wisdom. Paul concludes this section by talking about the need to be filled with the Spirit. This will become the dominant thought for the remaining material in chapter 5 on into chapter 6. Paul is very much concerned for this church, that they not allow the surrounding circumstances in which this church finds itself to set the tone and pace for the life of the church. The church is supposed to be totally devoted to Christ, understanding the times, comprehending God's will, and being controlled by the Spirit.
