

Intro to John 20:19-29

Happy (belated) Easter! Of course, many of you were not able to gather with us this first week back in church, but it is always a good time to celebrate Christ's resurrection! In fact, that is why the early Christians decided to gather on the first day of the week, because that was the day that Christ rose from the dead. This was (and continues to be) the most profound event in the history of mankind.

While many things distract us day by day, it is good that we reorient ourselves to the reality of Christ's resurrection. Because He
has risen from the grave, we have certainty about the promise of
our own future resurrection. But even beyond that, we have great
peace, purpose, and power in the present. Jesus's resurrection
precipitated the coming of the Holy Spirit whereby we now have
the power to live righteous lives that are not possible in the flesh.
Because Jesus rose again, we know our purpose of glorifying God
and seeking to make Him known in every sphere. This, of course,
includes evangelism, but it encompasses every aspect of our
lives—family, vocation, recreation, trials and suffering, church
life. Everything we do is now radically meaningful because of
Christ's resurrection. We must remember that always.

Context

John's Gospel comes to a climax in this passage. The stated purpose (immediately following our passage) is that those who read it might believe that Jesus is the Christ and that by believing we may have life in His name. The Gospel is filled with stories (signs) that point to Jesus's identity as the Christ, with mixed responses from the people He interacted with. However, the ultimate confession is made by "Doubting Thomas" when he declares that Jesus is his Lord and his God. May we find ourselves not only making the same declaration but living it out as well.
